On Wednesday, June 18, 2025, Vineland Research and Innovation Centre hosted a free networking event at the Mississauga Grand Banquet and Event Centre to spotlight the current landscape of the Canadian food upcycling sector.

Attendees included researchers, industry leaders, startups, and government representatives keen on collaborative innovation.
